#### Planning for the 2009-10 School Year!

It is hard to believe that we have just past the halfway point for the 2009-10 school year, a year of much change and of a great deal of progress.

First, be assured that Odyssey Academy is a very sound organization and continues to strive to serve the individual needs of each of our students. In that regard, we are particularly proud of the following for this school year:

- Enrollment is as high as it has ever been, currently 276. This compares around 160 last year.
   More importantly our school enrollment has varied less than 4 percent since September. This is a good sign of the stability we wish to maintain.
- Our sponsor and the State have approved another 3-year charter for our school, following a review of our program and financial status and projections.

- Volunteerism is a hallmark of the Odyssey Academy philosophy, and volunteerism is at an all-time high, thanks to our committed parents and community.
- We have developed systems to assure prudent financial stewardship of the funds we receive. Our annual independent audit was presented to the Board at its last meeting.
- Our improvement plan has been approved by the Minnesota Department of Education. We have implemented Professional Learning Communities for all grade levels. These staff groups meet every two weeks to keep a finger on the pulse of progress on goals and strategies to assure continuous education improvement to Odyssey.

As we begin planning for 2009-10, we look to continuing to build upon that which has made Odyssey the place you to which you have chosen to entrust you children. We have the capacity, the talent, and the will to do so.

### Odyssey C.A.R.E.S.

The C.A.R.E.S. program is a component of "Responsive Classroom" teacher training and a large part of Odyssey's school climate and characterdevelopment for all the students, kindergarten through eighth grade. The letters stand for Cooperation, Assertion, Responsibility, Empathy and Selfcontrol. Every other month each classroom has a discussion about what one of the words means and how we show that characteristic through our behavior. Then the students share who in the class has shown the characteristic, or has worked hard at and improved at the characteristic.

In January the focus was on "Responsibility". The students offered many good examples how to show responsibility. They mentioned taking care of personal and classroom supplies appropriately, being accountable for your own actions, caring about education and many other great ideas. These positions are not new, but are still very important. Please keep these opportunities in mind when you are planning your schedule.

**Literacy time** in all the grades need extra people to either work one-on-one students as they read, or help with small

groups. For  $1^{st}$  and  $2^{nd}$  grades, the time is 10:00-11:00, for  $3^{rd}-5^{th}$  grades, the time is 1:00-2:30. The  $6^{th}-8^{th}$  grades have classes throughout the morning hours. Improving literacy skills helps the students in all the classes and studies and helps to show improvements in the testing scores throughout the school.

We also need extra hands during **lunch periods** for kindergarten through fifth grades. Third through fifth grades eat from 11:50 – 12:15. Kindergarten through second eat from 12:15 – 12:40. Helping students with containers, assisting at the salad table, dispensing condiments and helping staff with dismissal times will be the main tasks.
