The C.A.R.E.S. program is a component of "Responsive Classroom" teacher training and a large part of Odyssey's school climate and character-development for all the students, kindergarten through eighth grade. The letters stand for Cooperation, Assertion, Responsibility, Empathy and Selfcontrol.

In March and April the focus was on "self control". The students talked about how to show self control and the classmates that they noticed often used self control, or had gained more self control over the school year. Some of the ways Odyssey students have been noticed to show self control are by taking care of their own business, communicating appropriately, and by remaining calm through stress.

At the April C.A.R.E.S. assembly the students that were nominated for "self control" were recognized. At that assembly we also recognized the teachers at Odyssey for their work this

year, in preparation for teacher appreciation day, on May 6.
