<u>Facebook/Texting – Are they Damaging</u> Your Student's <u>Education?</u>

Technology is a wonderful thing. It is fun, exciting and can be a great help in education. As a parent of teens and as a middle school teacher I also can see the down side of technology.

As a teacher, I send home missing assignment reports and the next day no assignments are turned in but I do hear about facebook conversations that took place the night before. Kids are sending hundreds of text messages in "text language" but cannot write an essay for Language Arts.

As a parent I deal with the same problems at my home. I put parental controls on our computer so computer time is limited. If you do not have parental controls and your student is failing a class or missing assignments, I would suggest you take the power cord from your computer and only plug in the computer when you are able to supervise. Are there times you can take your student's phone until homework is complete?

Parents have told me about the time spent on facebook instead of projects which are required at Odyssey. Many already are taking away the privilege of the internet. It gets even trickier when a parent works evenings and has a hard time monitoring their student.

The positive thing about the technology is that is can be an earned privilege. If students are not bringing home planners, or are not writing down missing assignments you have a

consequence when you take away the computer and phone privileges.

Remember, middle school parents have access to student's classes on line at any time. If students come home without assignments to work on when they know they are missing, I would deny their computer privileges until they learn to take responsibility for their work.

I think many of us do not realize the hours students are spending on computers and phones and the negative educational habits it is causing. My suggestion is to keep watch and keep the computers and phones as a privilege that is earned after succeeding in the classroom.

### Ongoing Fundraisers Opportunities

Remember to continue to save any "Box Tops for Education" symbols on participating products. Bring them into the school and deposit them in the "school bus" on the front entry table.
