Health Update

For the last few weeks we have had a small epidemic of strep in the school (about 5% of our students). We continue to have new cases every day. Please watch your student for symptoms, which have been predominantly headache, stomachache with no fever. If your student has these symptoms please take them to the doctor for a strep test. Thanks for your help.

<u>Is My Child Well Enough To Go To School?</u>

Many students and parents are frequently concerned about when students should stay home or attend school. The following is intended to help with this decision.

General Practices:

- If the student has had a fever of 100 degrees or more, the student should stay home for 24 hours <u>after</u> the temperature returns to normal, without fever reducing medication.
- If student has vomited or had diarrhea, the student should stay home <u>until</u> 24 hours <u>after</u> the last episode.
- If the student has had any rash that may be disease-related or cause is unknown, check with family physician <u>before</u> sending the student to school.
- If student is ill please call the school daily to report the illness at 763-549-2388. This number can be called 24 hours a day.
