On October 7, 8, and 9 Odyssey will hold the first trimester conferences. If circumstances allow that all children in your family do not attend a student's conference, please help us by informing other Odyssey staff members. It is a safety issue when children are unattended in the school hallways, or outside, while the parent(s) is/are in a classroom conference.

During conference times there will be two other happenings going on in the school. In the media center, there will be a **Scholastic Book Fair**. Stop in and pick up some new books to interest your student(s)! Also, the teachers put in very long days during conference week. On the conference days, many teachers are not even able to break away for dinner. We ask that the families help them out by bringing in **food for the teachers** to snack on and for their dinner. Parents or older siblings can read out loud to younger students that cannot read.

Students may also collect sponsors for the Read-A-Thon. The money raised will be used to purchase library materials. All packets and money are due to the school by Thursday, October 8.

There will be prizes for the top fundraiser in each team and for the students with the most minutes read in each team. Teams will be kindergarten, first and second grades, third through fifth grades, and sixth through eighth grades.
